The minutes of May 11, 2005 were approved.

A combined teams application for Honeoye and Bloomfield in JV boys lacrosse for 2005-2006 was approved.

Resignations from Mark Michele (girls lacrosse) and Mark Hoyt (wrestling) as Section coordinators were accepted with regret and commendation.

After some discussion the revised classification policy was approved. Coordinators will use the new policy in determining 2005-2006 classifications.

Joe Sposato and Jim Zumbo reported on the first meeting of the non-public school classification committee. Meeting dates have been set for next year. Section winners over the past two years will be updated so that state criteria can be used to determine possible move-ups.

There was discussion of the appointments of sport coordinators. Candidates will be interviewed before selection. Duties and responsibilities will also be reviewed before they begin their respective assignments.

Summer meeting was discussed. Ed Stores will serve as proxy for Jim Zumbo.

2005-2006 meeting dates were set. They will be posted on the web site.

There was discussion regarding a track official and a follow-up letter sent. There has been no response. The official will be contacted.

Section V will support the Championship Site Selection Committee recommendations at the summer meetings.

A treasurer report was given showing the current status of expenses and revenues by sport to date. The finance committee will be involved in recommendations to improve the financial condition of some sports.

Scholar-Athlete teams for the spring season were announced.

Teams of One were approved for Honeoye in girls swimming (Livonia) and Livonia in girls gymnastics (R-H).

SPORT COORDINATOR REPORTS

John Englert, girls tennis, proposed an alignment similar to boys tennis, Classes AA and A will remain as is with separate team and individual tournaments. Classes BB, B, and CC, C will run separate team sectionals but will remain combined for individuals. This format was approved.

Marty Martin, girls volleyball, proposed a format allowing Class AA and A (8 teams) to participate in one sectional tournament with a procedure to allow an AA team and an A team to go on to regionals if they qualify. This was approved.

Scott Fake, girls swimming, reviewed dates for state competition at Erie CC. There were no action items.

Bev Hooper, field hockey, gave a pre-season report. The format will be the same as last season.

Paula Summit, girls gymnastics, did not request any action items.

Joanne Small and Pam Palmer, cheerleading, reported on costs associated with their respective competitions. Geneseo State will continue to be used to host the events. Dates for 05-06 were announced.

Julie Odenbach, girls golf, reported on the success of this past season. The sport is growing and we are getting closer to a State Tournament.

Dale Ladd and Bob Goodell, boys and girls cross country, requested the flexibility of using September 15 as a cut-off date for DD and D schools should they be split. After discussion, this was defeated.

Kathy Ferrari, bowling, asked the Section to support the two day format for the State Tournament at the summer meeting. The Section will support this.
