EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE - October 30, 2006

Approved the following items:

2007-2008 Dues Increase - The NYSPHSAA dues will be increased by \$50 per school district (\$750.00) and .05 cents per student (.80 cents).

Wrestling - The use of the Communicable Skin Disease Form for the 2006-2007 season. In addition, wrestlers with oral braces are required to wear a mouth guard covering the braces. Approved for the 2007-2008 season 22 Points for the individual wrestler and multiple entries in tournaments.

Basketball Championships 2008 - The dates for the NYSPHSAA Girls and Boys Basketball Tournament will be March 14-16, 2008.

Girls Lacrosse - A waiver for the 2007 season a waiver to permit the wearing of uniforms that do not meet the new numbering requirement. Be advised that for the 2008 season uniforms will be required to have 6" numbers on the front and 8" numbers on the back and centrally on the uniform.

Cross Country - A variation in classification numbers for two years, beginning in the 2007-2008 school year. AA 1083 and above, A 712-1082, B 468-711, C 290-467 and D 289 and below.

Transfer Language - "Students who *transfer* from any school may enroll in the public school district of their residence *or private school within that district's boundaries* shall be exempt from the Transfer Rule. Such a transfer without penalty will only be permitted once in a high school career. (*change in italics*) Under Exemptions of the Transfer Rule - "A student of a military employee who is transferred to an active military base may enroll in the non-public school closest to their residence and maintain eligibility if the student enrolls in a non-public school immediately following the change in residence." 1

Boys Lacrosse - In 2008 all jerseys shall be of a single, solid color with specific trim specifications (NFHS rule 1-9-1).

Wrestling - A wrestler caught cheating on the hydration test will be an ineligible wrestler for the remainder of the season.
