SEVENTH WEEK BIRDS EYE FOODS-SECTION V SOFTBALL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

One girl was selected for the third straight week. She had three wins last week, allowing only five earned runs. She also had 18 K's over those three games. At the plate she had home runs in two of the games. She was among those that have been named Birds Eye Foods-Section V Softball Players of the Week*. Here are the players that earned this honor in the seventh week of this season.

ALLEGANY I: Amber Harding of Fillmore ... Senior second baseman *Harding* hit .636 with a triple, nine RBI's and seven put outs last week to help her team go 4-0.

ALLEGANY II: Marce Ann Dunning of Canaseraga... Eighth grade right fielder *Dunning* was four-for-seven with a home run, double and three RBI's. She also threw out three runners and pitched her first game with 12 K's and giving up only five hits.

FINGER LAKES EAST I: Liz Pieniasek of Geneva ... *Pianiazek*, a junior pitcher, hurled a perfect game against Midlakes, striking out 20 batters. She also won both games in the Wayne Tournament and was named MVP. This included a one hitter against Lyons and a two hitter in the championship game against Wayne.

FINGER LAKES EAST II: Kate Disbrow of Penn Yan ... *Disbrow*, a sophomore shortstop, finished last week batting .727 along with 12 fielding assists and four stolen bases.

FINGER LAKES WEST: Montana McDonald of Romulus ... Senior shortstop *McDonald* went 10-for-14 at the plate with a home run, triple, three doubles and nine RBI's. In the field she had 16 assists including two at the plate.

GENESEE: Kate Kearney of Pembroke ... Senior pitcher *Kearney* was 3-0 last week with four hits allowed and 39 strikeouts. She also had eight hits with a home run and two triples.

xLIVINGSTON I: Terin Brown of Wayland-Cohocton... Senior pitcher *Brown* went eight-for-15 over four games, scoring five runs and driving in seven. She had a home run, two triples, two doubles and pilfered two bases.

LIVINGSTON II: Natasha Kersch of Warsaw ... *Kersch* went three-for-five against an undefeated Perry pitcher, driving in the winning run with a triple in the top of the 10th inning. During a week where Warsaw played every day, she was asked to pitch

her first game of the year against Geneseo. She got the win, striking out eight and allowing five hits in seven innings. She also scored seven runs during the week and stole four bases.

MONROE I: Stacy Kuwick of Fairport and Leah Tackling of Spencerport ... Senior pitcher *Kuwick* earned three wins last week, allowing only three hits and striking out 33 batters in 16 innings. She also was six-for-11 at bat with four extra base hits and six RBI's.

Tackling, a senior third baseman, was seven-for-11 with three doubles, six RBI's, two runs scored and two stolen bases.

MONROE II: Erika Hoppner of Webster Thomas ... Senior pitcher *Hoppner* is selected for the third straight week. She had three wins last week, allowing only five earned runs. She also had 18 K's over those three games. At the plate she had home runs in two of the games.

MONROE III: Dana Solcz of Pittsford Sutherland and Bethany Wolff of Brighton ... Freshman second baseman *Solcz* was five-for-10 with a home run, three runs scored and 10 RBI's. Her YTD on base percentage is .405.

Wolff, a senior pitcher, won four games last week. She pitched 35 innings with 32 K's and a 1.40 ERA. Opposing teams batted .215 against her.

PRIVATE-PAROCHIAL: Laura Casper of Aquinas and Betsy Clark of Bishop Kearney... Senior second baseman *Casper*, a lead off hitter, was eight-for-17 over five games with three runs scored, four RBI's and five stolen bases. She also had 25 put outs and no errors in the field.

Clark, a sophomore pitcher, pitched 36 innings last week which included three wins. Each win was a one-hitter with two shut outs. For the week she had 47 K's and only one walk. At the plate she went nine-for-17 and was named to the Private-Parochial All Tournament team.

STEUBEN I: Autumn Stone of Campbell-Savona ... Senior pitcher *Stone* recorded 31 K's last week and allowed 16 hits in 95 at bats. She allowed only six runs to score in four games and only four of them were earned. She hit at a .633 clip.

STEUBEN II: Kateland Ball of Hammondsport ... Sophomore catcher *Ball* was seven-for-11 last week with five runs scored, seven RBI's, a double and two stolen bases. She also threw out three attempting base stealers.

WAYNE COUNTY: Lindsay Stowell of Gananda ... Junior infielder *Stowell*
was six-for-11 with four RBI's and four stolen bases as Gananda remained unbeaten.
